Service Project...

La Conner Sunrise Food Bank had its roots as a home-based food bank started by Kevin Sunrise in 2005. It currently distributes food each week to at least 90 families - both in-house and to homes.

They order and receive food weekly from major state-wide food collection organizations - Northwest Harvest and Food Lifeline. They also receive donations of seasonal-produce from local farms, such as Hedlin Farms. Another source is weekly donation of extra produce from local grocers such as Haggen.

This year, they are most in need of truly canned items (opposed to boxed goods) as canned soups, and canned fruits are always in high demand. Well over 1,000 people a month benefit from their services. As Winter comes they expect the numbers to dramatically increase.

THIS YEAR....we would like to add small, travel size toiletries (items small enough to fit in a quart size zip lock baggie) such as toothpaste, toothbrushes, deodorant, lotion, shampoo, tissues, dental floss, chapstick, small hand sanitizer, small travel tide laundry soap etc.to give to women in shelters.
